Our students deserve the best, and we are geared up to provide the best possible opportunities for each student to be successful. Over the summer, our staff and administrators have had many professional development sessions to learn more about literacy and instructional practices to help improve student achievement. For school year 2011-12, our teachers will be having increased expectations for the students, just as we have increased expectations of teachers and our administrators. We are pleased to share that the expectations we had for student achievement last year resulted in our district achieving Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) status for student achievement on the Pennsylvania System of School Assessment. For this coming year, the expected proficiency level for attaining AYP will increase. That makes it imperative for us to "crank up" our efforts for student success.

Another project that our teachers have worked on last year, under the direction of Dr. Kehr, has been a change in the way we will report student progress to parents. Parents will be hearing more about this at back-to-school nights and through the principals' newsletters. We are excited about this as we feel certain that this new process will be more accurate and provide our parents with more detailed reporting about students' academic success as well as habits and behaviors that affect that success.

At the conclusion of last year, a survey completed by all students and staff was done to determine how diversity issues are perceived in our district. A district-wide committee will be studying the survey results and making action plans based on the survey results. It is important that all students feel safe and secure in the manner in which all are treated.

In addition, we are excited to announce a new system of communicating with our parents. We will have an automated phone messaging system that will enhance our ability to communicate with parents. Important messages, such as weather related information or any emergency closings, will now be sent to parents by phone. Parents will be hearing more about this when first day information is sent home with students.

Our South Western School District School Board, administration, and staff are a dedicated team, and we are striving to make a difference in the lives of our students and in our community. As always we appreciate your support.

Start Off Smart & Safe! Riding The Bus

BE AT LEAST FIVE MINUTES EARLY

Have your child at their bus stop at least five minutes early. Since the elementary run is scheduled before the other runs, drivers do not have the flexibility to wait for late arrivals.

BE PATIENT, DELAYS MAY HAPPEN

During the first two weeks of school, the buses may not be on schedule. Drivers need a bit of extra time to help students who are new or unsure of their buses. At the end of the day, drivers will not leave the school until they are sure all the students are on the bus. Delays of up to 15 minutes may occur. By the third week of school, buses should be on schedule.

REASSURANCE FOR YOUNG ONES

Take young children to the bus stop before school starts. Familiarize them with the surroundings. Reassure your child that the bus driver WILL bring them home, but may take other children home first.

IN CASE OF EMERGENCY...

RETURN THOSE EMERGENCY FORMS!

Please fill out or correct your child's emergency information as soon as possible for updates. These forms keep your child safe in case of an emergency and the district must have accurate and up-to-date information. **ALSO NOTE: the info on your student data sheet is also required for the district's new "school messenger," an automatic system that will contact parents via telephone with important updates.**

PERMISSIONS FOR ASTHMA INHALERS

State law requires that school districts have a policy regarding students' self-administration of asthma inhalers. The medication policy for the school district reflects this law. Students are permitted to carry and self-administer emergency medication such as an asthma inhaler with written permission from parent(s), a physician's order and after review by the school nurse.

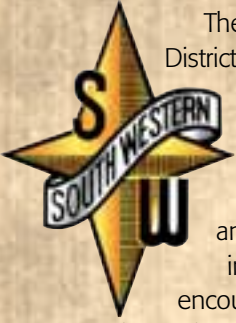
FOOD ALLERGIES
