Looking Forward

Learners have a voice and choice for self-directed, customized learning supported by a caring and progressive network of educators.

As approved by our school board this past year, this is the new vision for our district. You may be wondering, just what is a vision statement. A vision statement is a description of what we want to accomplish in the next six years. It will serve as our guide for choosing specific courses of action. It becomes the framework for all of our planning for students. In essence, it describes our hopes and our dreams to ensure that all students reach their potential and experience success. It is a constant reminder of what we hope to achieve. It drives all of our actions.

As indicated in the vision statement, one of the components is that all learners will have choice. One of their choices will be in the manner in which they show that they have achieved mastery in the content area. The road to achieve this will involve much professional development for our teachers, changes in the way we currently do the day-to-day business of school, and changes for the expectations of our students.

One necessary component to make our vision a reality is that students need equal access to technology that can enable them to have individual choice in their daily work at school. Our plan is to eventually provide computer access for every student, so that there is equality for all. That cannot happen in one or two years. This year, we have two phases planned for the high school students to receive computers. High school students and parents will be informed in September how this will happen.

This is our first step for students. Through this district newsletter and through our social media site, you will be regularly informed of our progress. We are very excited and enthusiastic about the possibilities this vision statement will afford for all of our students.

School Board Meetings are conducted at 7 PM on the second and fourth Wednesdays of the month in the Administrative Conference Room, unless otherwise announced. Residents are invited to attend. Requests to formally address the Board should be made in writing to the Superintendent's office ten days in advance of public meetings.

Riding the Bus



Be Five Minutes Early

Have your child at their bus stop at least five minutes early. Since the elementary run is scheduled before others, drivers do not have the flexibility to wait for late arrivals.

Be Patient, Delays Happen

During the first two weeks of school, the buses may not be on schedule. Drivers need extra time to help students who are new or unsure of their buses. At the end of the day, drivers will not leave the school until they are sure all students are on the bus. Delays of up to 15 minutes may occur. By the third week of school, buses should be on schedule.

Reassurance For Young Ones

Take young children to the bus stop before school starts. Familiarize them with the surroundings. Reassure your child that the bus driver WILL bring them home, but may take other children home first.

The medication policy for the district follows state law regarding students' self-administration of asthma inhalers. Students are permitted to carry and self-administer emergency medication such as an asthma inhaler with written permission from parent(s), a physician's order and after review by the school nurse.

South Western Education Foundation 5K Run/Walk

On **Saturday, October 4th** the South Western Education Foundation will host a 5K Run/Walk to raise funds to be used for students in the coming school year.

The event is an all ages, family friendly walk or run, starting from EHMIS. Check in is from 7:30 - 8:30am that morning with start times at 9am. The stadium concession stand will be open and available during the 5K event.

The Foundation is a non-profit organization, created to help teachers, staff and administrators implement unique educational opportunities. When these folks request Foundation funds, they submit a proposal summarizing the program

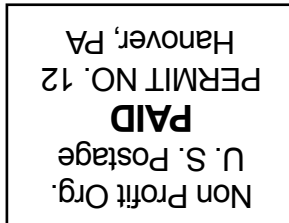


they'd like to implement. The proposal then goes before a nine person board, who review and take the proposal to committee each year. Applications for funds are due each April and reviewed by June of that year. The board then decides who gets funding and which programs are created.

Last school year, eleven proposals were submitted, and four grants were given for a total of \$5,898. The grants will be used by teachers to benefit students in the learning process.
